Jake

Jake is a 15-year-old car and train lover from Wexford. Having nephrotic syndrome means that Jake's kidneys do not function properly. However, Jake's critical illness does not hold him back. Because he spends so much time indoors, he has ample time to build his trains and learn about cars.

When Jake met with his Make-A-Wish® volunteers he already had a plan for his wish. His face lit up as he described the Test Track at Epcot in the Walt Disney World® Resort. The Test Track is a simulated excursion of the testing procedures that General Motors uses to evaluate new concept cars.

Once arriving in Disney, Jake got to design his own car and then take it through a round of tests, seeing how it performed compared to other cars. His parents recall sitting at dinner after an activity filled day, listening as Jake

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went on and on explaining everything he had learned. He was so proud of the car he had developed and how it had performed. It reminded Jake that he was capable of anything he set his mind to.

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Visit Captiva Island

Frequently, kids experiencing tough times are asked to close their eyes and find their happy place. This 17-year-old would do just that when experiencing treatments for her cancer. She would squeeze her eyes shut and imagine beaches for miles, the warm sun, and sand between her toes. This Wexford-native started planning her wish when she was first diagnosed. However, due to the complexity of her critical illness it wasn't until two years later that her wish would be realized, giving her lots of time to fantasize about what would soon be a life-changing experience.

When meeting with her Make-A-Wish volunteers, she described the happy place she would escape to, wondering if there was anywhere as magical, she could visit for her wish. Through her descriptions, volunteers realized that perfect place. This wish kid and her family would be headed to Captiva Island, Florida—it was time to make her dream a reality.

Captiva Island has 15 miles of beaches to be explored, and she planned to do just that. Each morning the whole family would start the day enjoying breakfast, her favorite meal. They would eat, laugh and relax, enjoying time together while watching the waves crash. It was the peace



they needed during such a difficult period.

This family will always have the memories of being together, and for this lovely girl, now when she squeezes her eyes shut and escapes to her happy place, she doesn't picture a dream, she pictures a tangible reality that would not have been possible without Make-A-Wish.


